# Understanding "foodscapes"

In Canada's northern territories, foodscapes are shaped by a tapestry of Indigenous knowledge and practices, interest in local subsistence food production, and the challenges posed by a harsh climate.



## Yukon

The foodscape of the Yukon:

- blend of tradition and modernity
- diverse agricultural practices amongst First Nations groups and Yukon farmers
- long supply routes, limited critical services, abundance of opportunities





# The Northwest Territories (NWT)

The foodscape of the Northwest Territories (NWT)

- traditional Indigenous practices and values
- market and community gardens
- supply managed eggs
- very high input costs
- highly regulated (ex no commercial livestock)
- strength in value added and small scale food processing
- research and demonstration farm

















### Nunavut

The foodscape of Nunavut:

- harsh Arctic environment
- traditional hunting, fishing, and foraging
- no land based agriculture
- highest rates of food insecurity in Canada

The foodscape of Nunavut reflects a blend of traditional knowledge and modern opportunities, emphasizing a strong connection to the land, community values, and the ongoing pursuit of food sovereignty.




